

ANNOUNCEMENT

The Cytology, Histology and Embryology exam
will be held in two days in the following order:

① Students sit for exam in white coats, with the student book and the Practicum from the practical lessons in Cytology, Histology and Embryology! ! Mobile phones are not allowed during the exam!

EXEMPTION:

- *Cytology Colloquium* - 90% - students exempt the Cytology section (practical, MCQ test and the written part)
- *Total score points* - 90% (126p.) - students exempt both practical and MCQ test of Cytology, Histology and Embryology sections
- *Students with less than 90%* (<126p) of the total semester points start with the practical exam. If they pass the practical, they sit for the MCQ test. If they pass the MCQ test, they sit for the essay part (one question from General Histology of the Conspectus).

First Day - 15.01.2018

I. Practical part

7.30 – REGISTRATION in the Department of Anatomy, Histology and Embryology

8.00 – Practical exam

- *Histology* - 8 microscopic preparations and 4 electronograms. Students, who manage 60% of the microscopic preparations and electronograms (respectively 7) are allowed to sit for the MCQ test.
- *Cytology* - 2 microscopic preparations and 1 electronogram – the minimum of Cytology part is 60% (respectively 2).

The practical exam and the MSQ test once passed will be valid for all the subsequent exams !

II. Theoretical test – Auditorium complex

- **LONG TEST (30 min)** – MCQ test on the three sections (Cytology, Histology and Embryology) - questions of varying degrees of difficulty. Total points – 60 points. Students must complete 60% of the total points of the test (**36 points**).
- **SHORT TEST (20 min)** - Students who have 90% of Cytology Colloquium sit for the MCQ test on Histology and Embryology. Total points – 40 points. Students must complete 60% of the total points of the test (**24 points**).

III. Written theoretical part

One question from General Histology of the Conspectus (45 min).

Second Day – 16.01.2018

Oral exam. The final mark of the exam is formed by 70% of the mark from the test and the written part, and 30% from the current mark of the semester.
